For many years, Melissa struggled to overcome substance abuse and because of that, she received a lot of intervention from local agencies to ensure her children and babies grew up in a safe and healthy home. It was then that Melissa learned about Beginnings. Through our parenting support programs, she was encouraged by staff and volunteers to bravely pursue complete recovery. As a result, she was determined to become a better mom so that she can truly nurture her children. With the help of various community agencies including Beginnings, Melissa persevered through the rehabilitation process, beat her addictions and has kept herself sober for several years now.

Melissa's new baby was born premature and realizing that she did not have the right size of clothing prepared for her little one, Melissa came straight to Beginnings from the hospital. She knew we would be able to supply her with the extra clothing she needed to fit her tiny little one and we even found a car seat cover to go over her new car seat! Today, Melissa continues to check in with Beginnings and access our Care Cupboard as needed. Always cheerful, with her baby and toddler tagging along, one could never surmise the kind of life Melissa has been through.

Melissa's courage is reminiscent of a familiar account in the Bible where Peter, one of Jesus' disciples, dared to step out of the boat in the middle of a storm to walk on water towards Jesus. Her decision to pursue hope and complete recovery from years of substance abuse so that she can be the best mom to her children is not far different from Peter's miraculous feat. Melissa dared to continue taking brave steps forward in the middle of a storm. In moments when she felt like sinking in the process, Beginnings staff, together with other community partners, did what Jesus did to Peter when he was sinking. We all extended our hands with God's grace to pull her up, helped her overcome her fears and doubts, so she can keep on taking small steps forward. We are indeed blessed to be a part of empowering Melissa in her parenting journey, and we look forward to witnessing many other moms like her see their own stories of victory unfold. ~

Having raised 6 children

I first volunteered as a parent aide with Family & Children's Services for about 2 years," shares Sandy. "During that time, a lady from my church was helping in the Care Cupboard of Beginnings and through her, I began to take bags of donated clothes home with me to wash and mend if needed. This is how I got started helping out in the Care Cupboard."

That was 8 years ago, and what started as 2 hours a week at the Care Centre sorting through donations has turned into 1 full day a week, sorting and helping wherever she's needed. "I'm happy to continue to try to keep the Care Cupboard looking nice for our clients. It's a job not everyone wants to commit to, but I can sort and fold pretty fast now! I like organizing stuff so it's a great place for me," adds Sandy. "I realized that this job is important to our clients, and it is the first thing they see when they come into the Care Centre. Q: What got you interested in volunteering at Beginnings?

Liz: When I decided I wanted to go into adoption or social services, I googled some local agencies in the hopes of finding inspiration for my future through the multiple opportunities in these fields. I came across a couple local agencies but was blown away by the services that Beginnings offered and had to be a part of it – so I emailed about volunteering. I thought it was best to gain experience to better understand the adoption and social service environment. I was also looking for a mentor, of sorts, to guide me through my experiences and support my research into my future.

Q: When did you start and how has your role evolved?

Liz: I started as a volunteer in September 2018 – supporting where needed. As I was becoming more familiar with my role and the environment, Beginnings was growing and a position for an Operations Assistant became available. Cherylynn knew that I was looking for part-time work and that I loved volunteering so offered an interview. In October, I became the Operations Assistant.

Q: How would you describe your experience working at Beginnings?

Liz: I get a sense of fulfillment with work. Being in school to work in this field, I've been able to implement skills directly in my work at Beginnings. The staff have positively impacted these learning experiences for me as they've supported my growth with constructive feedback. My hopes of finding a mentor came true as the staff throughout the entire agency blessed me with advice, followed up on learning opportunities, and even sat down and looked at options for my future profession. Given the privilege to form trusting relationships with clients has been the most rewarding experience. Watching the children grow healthy and loved as well as seeing the motivation from the parent(s) to provide for their child(ren) in the best way they can is truly inspiring.
